We are a large special school organised over 3 sites in Torbay catering for a range of learners with complex educational needs and disabilities.



Mayfield School

At Mayfield School in Torquay we have 180 pupils with severe and profound learning difficulties arranged in 19 classes from Foundation through to Key Stage 4. We have highly skilled staff and fantastic facilities to support the ongoing development of every pupils' EHCP needs in a safe, nurturing and happy environment.



Mayfield College

At Mayfield College in Paignton we have 51 students in Key Stage 4 and 5 with severe and profound learning difficulties. The highly skilled College team provide a holistic programme of study for our young people which utilises challenging, relevant and fun learning experiences whilst supporting individual progression and preparation for adulthood.



Mayfield Chestnut

At Mayfield Chestnut in Brixham we have 32 Primary aged pupils with social, emotional and mental health difficulties arranged in 6 classes. Our highly skilled staff support our pupils to maintain academic progress whilst securing attachment and promoting resilience and wellbeing through playfulness, acceptance, curiosity and empathy.

Thestudents who attend Mayfield Chestnut exhibit a wide range of social, emotional and mental health and educational needs, which by their nature can impinge upon their progress. We work on trauma informed principles and provide a flexible curriculum that addresses all areas of the individual students' needs.

Where possible this results in children returning to a mainstream provision or us supporting them into a specialist provision that can meet their needs.

Staff are fully trained to use the PACE approach, supported by Thrive activities. Alongside a carefully tailored and individualised Education Provision Plan, we offer pastoral care to the children and their families. We cover the requirements of the National Curriculum, providing a stimulating, broad, balanced and differentiated curriculum which enables our students to get the most out of their learning.

Confident Individuals

Our learners are guided by all staff on how to approach every day challenges. This could be on the playground, in a game, or in class in a complex learning challenge. The impact should be that children don't give up, are highly empowered to succeed, achieve at a high standard and are independent and nurturing.

Successful Learners

Through the curriculum at Chestnut we strive to ensure that our children's attainment in core and foundation subjects is in line with , or exceeding their potential when we consider the invariably low starting points they may have had. We measure this carefully using a wide range of data, but always considering age related expectations. We intend that our children will be academically and physically prepared for life in their next school stage and in the wider community.

Responsible Citizens

We want our learners to become rounded characters with a clear understanding of complex values such as equality, friendship, trust and citizenship. From this they will develop skills which prepare them for living in the community, demonstrating tolerance and equality. We measure this not just by the work our children produce, but in the behaviours we see each and every day in a variety of settings. Our learners will be motivated by a strong personal sense of morality. They will make decisions based on these good values and be resilient to the influence of others.





Curriculum Implementation

We recognise that all children are on a learning journey and our curriculum takes into account their initial staring point, their preferred learning style and their future destination, whilst covering all areas of the National Curriculum. Learning activities are personalised and tailored to the individual.

We have a sharp focus on developing reading skills and all children engage with reading on a daily basis through synthetic phonics, whole word reading and reading for comprehension and pleasure.

Each term students focus their learning on a specific topic, from minibeasts and life cycles, to ancient history and religious festivals around the world.

Maths is taught using the Rose Maths Scheme.

We incorporate PSHE, SMSC and British Values into all areas of the curriculum.

Children are given opportunities to learn in 1:1, small group and whole class groups.

The school environment is designed to ensure children feel safe enough to take risks in their learning and are conducive to optimising progress.

Engage

A stage of learning that provides children with an inspiring and thought provoking starting point that stirs curiosity and initiates interest.

Children engage in purposeful and contextualised learning experiences both in and out of the classroom to provide the stimulus to learn.

Develop

Children develop and expand their knowledge, understanding and subject skills in order to progress their learning and attainment through quality focused differentiation, learning tasks and high quality relevant learning experiences.

Children become industrious learners making sense of information and experiences, leading to good progress and sound understanding...

Imnovate:

A stage of learning that challenges childrens' ability to work creatively, exploring solutions and possibilities.

Using and applying previously learned skills and understanding, children work together to innovate, managing their own learning to achieve given success

A stage of learning that empowers children to share, celebrate and reflect with a range of partners and audiences. Children cement their learning through shared reflection with peers and adults and are able to suggest next steps in their learning.

Teachers discuss, review and support both individual and group evaluations using their observations and evidence to make summative assessments.









There are 6 classrooms at Chestnut as well as an additional class based at The Annexe up at Mayfield College. Our dedicated teachers are supported by at least 2 teaching assistants per class to assist the pupils with their learning.

All of our classrooms are fully equipped to reflect the needs of pupils at Primary age.

Each classroom has an interactive smart board and reading area. There is also a wide range of resources for science and art sessions.











Food Tech Room

Chestnut has a dedicated Food Tech room, which all pupils have regular scheduled access to.

Here, pupils learn vital self help and independence skills during practical lessons.

We encourage pupils to explore healthy food options, discuss and create new recipes and to understand good food hygiene practices.



Library

Pupils are able to access our fun and inviting library space thoughout the day. The shelves are regularly stocked with a variety of story books as well as books relating to topics covered in class. Pupils are encouraged to read for pleasure to embed skills and knowledge as well as to ignite their imagination.







ICT Suite

Chestnut has some incredible equipment in the ICT suite and is a firm favourite amongst the pupils. As the world we live in becomes ever more digital based, pupils are able to learn a variety of skills, from animation, coding, photography and the use of green screen technology.

Pupils have access to both Apple Macs, PCs, laptops, Tablets and Oculus VR headsets ensuring they leave Chestnut with a wealth of technological knowledge.









Beach School

With a variety of beaches just a short distnace away, pupils are able to enjoy Beach School sessions when the weather allows. Usually led by Nicky, sessions include geocaching, rock-pooling and even crabbing at Stoke Gabriel.

Pupils learn about the tides, sea creatures, erosion and geology whilst building on team work and communication skills.















PROMOTING MOVEMENT







MUGA & Playground

Regular movement and exercise can help our pupils to remain healthy and aid them in regulating their behaviours.

Sport inhabits a large portion of our pupils leisure and recreational time and our bright and colourful multi-use games area provides a great space for a variety of ball games.

Trim Trail

Installed a few years ago by a team of eager volunteers and pupils, the trim trail provides an alternative space for pupils to play with their peers.

The trail features wobbly bridges, climbing walls and posts, monkey nets, balance bars and a slide; perfect for pupils to test out their balance and coordination skills.

Multi-Purpose Hall

Our hall is nestled in the centre of the school and is used for a variety of different activities throughout the day.

The hall is used for yoga, boxing, dancing, basketball and general PE sessions which are currently being run by Select Soccer.

Sports Field

Located next to our trim trail, the sports field often serves as an extension of the classroom when the weather allows it.

During lunchtimes, after school and even some weekends, our football players are practicing their skills and working on their teamwork and communication

Wildlife Pond

The large purpose built pond provides a perfect space for pupils to explore mini-beasts and common aquatic plants for both leisure and practical learning activities.

With seating along one side of the pond, it also provides a calm and quiet space for pupils when needed.

Football Squad

We are very proud of our football team here at Chestnut and pupils have worked hard over the last few years. They now play against other Primary schools and are sponsored by Rockfish who provide their kit.

Being part of the team is a great way to feel part of their local community and to feel proud of their school. The pupils have grown in confidence and self-esteem.

Community Amenities

Swimming is part of the curriculum at Chestnut and pupils access the local swimming pool in Brixham for lessons.

Pupils also access local beaches, woods, recreational parks such as Decoy and the skate park in Brixham building on physical and social skills.



Places of Interest

Regular visits to places of interest within the community offer additional learning opportunities, often linked to current topics.

Stover Park, Occombe Farm and Paignton Zoo offer hands on experiences to nature topics, whilst local museums, castles and attractions such as the Golden Hind or Berry Head help to bring history topics to life and engage pupils.
